What's On In School

There are nine periods in the school day.

Each period lasts 35 minutes, except on a Wednesday morning when each period lasts for 30 minutes.

Pupils move from class to class during the day.

They have a double period for Art & Design, Home Economics, ICT, Music, Technology & Design, and P.E., which are practical subjects.

There is a split-lunch. This means Years 8, 9 and 10 have lunch together between 12.20 pm – 1.00 pm. The pupils in the Senior school have their lunch from 1.00pm - 1.40 pm when junior pupils go to class.

Counselling

A Senior Teacher co-ordinates a counselling service within the school. It is provided by a counsellor from Family Works and an independent registered counsellor. Counselling is available to pupils at their own or at their parents' request and on the recommendation of Year Heads.

Pupils' Images

Pupils' images are recorded from time to time as they participate in class, school trips, teams, sports days, competitions, productions and special events or simply to highlight their achievements.

The images are displayed on school notice boards, the web site, multi-media presentations, in publications such as the school magazine and, on occasion, in the local press. Pupils are normally proud to see their achievements thus recognised.

It is assumed that parents consent to having their child's image recorded or displayed. Please note that if you want to withhold your consent you should let the Principal know in writing, stating your child's name and that of his/her Tutor.

Homework

Homework is central to the learning process of the pupil. It extends and consolidates classroom learning and encourages pupils to develop independent research and study skills. For homework to be effective an active partnership between pupils, teachers and parents is necessary.

Parents are asked to take a keen interest in their child's homework and to ensure that it is done in an environment suitable for study. A reasonable amount of time should be spent on homework and private study each evening and at weekends. Year 8 should spend at least 1 hour per day. When homework is completed within the recommended time pupils should devote the remainder of the time to private study.

Assessment

You will receive a report on your child's progress at the end of November, at the end of March, and in June.



Attendance and Punctuality

Regular Attendance

Please ensure that your child attends school every day unless he/she is ill.

Holidays during Term Time

In particular, please do not disrupt your child's progress and development in school by arranging any family holidays during term time.

Absence

If your child is absent, even for one day, please phone the School Office before 10am. If you have not done so, the Student Secretary will phone or text you to ensure that your child is absent with your consent and for a valid reason. On your child's return to school, please send in a completed absence note (at the back of the Student Planner) to his/her Tutor, outlining the reason for the absence. This note is necessary for our school records.

Appointments

Please try to arrange all appointments outside school hours.

If this is not possible and your child has to go out of school, for example, for an orthodontic appointment, please send in a completed appointment note (at the back of the Student Planner) to the Tutor asking permission for your child to leave school and **explaining the transport arrangements you have made.**

If you have an appointment card, please enclose it with the note. Please also ensure that your child misses only the time required for the appointment.

Pupils are **not permitted** to leave school without this note from their parents.

Sickness

If your child is sick and unable to continue in class, the Principal's secretary will contact you, using the contact numbers filed on the school computer system. It is essential that you have arrangements in place for your child in case he/she has to go home during the school day.

It is, likewise, essential that you inform the school of any change in your contact details.

Improving Links with School

We have implemented Schoolcomms, an electronic school communication system, as a means of improving communication with parents. Schoolcomms is registered with the Data Protection Act and all information that parents provide is confidential and will not be passed on to any other organisation. Details will only be used for the purpose of school business and parents will not receive any SPAM or marketing material.

Mobile Phones

All mobile phones must be switched off from 8.45 am until 3.25 pm. Pupils are not permitted to make or receive texts or calls for any reason during the school day. Pupils wishing to contact home must go to Reception. Mobile phones may be used to contact parents from 3.25pm onwards.



Lunchtime Arrangements

At lunchtime pupils in Year 8 eat their own lunches or can pre-order from the Pop-up Canteen. They will be shown how to use the online pre-order form in Tutor Group . Dinners cost £2.80 while snacks vary in price. Weather permitting, pupils go outside after they have eaten for recreation.

Canteen Arrangements

Healthy Eating: We want to promote healthy eating throughout the school community. As part of this we are providing a broad menu of healthy eating dishes and snacks in the canteen. We ask parents to engage with us in this campaign. You can help by encouraging your child to eat only healthy foods while they are in school.

Peanut Allergies: We have a number of pupils who suffer from a severe peanut allergy which is potentially fatal. It is essential that they do not come into contact with peanuts or any peanut related product. We ask you therefore to ensure that your child does not bring peanuts or any peanut related product into school at any time.

The canteen is open every morning for breakfast at 8.30am. It is also open at breaktime and lunchtime.

Cashless Vending

We operate a cashless vending system in the canteen which means that there are no cash transactions at the tills. The system is cardless and based on index finger recognition. A pupil's canteen account is credited by using ParentPay, an online payments system.

ParentPay

With ParentPay you can top-up school meals, pay for trips and make other payments in the school at a time that suits you using a debit or credit card. There is no need for pupils to bring cash into school.

Free Dinners

Pupils who are eligible for free dinners will have their canteen account credited automatically on a daily basis to the value of £2.80. This can only be spent at lunchtime and cannot be carried forward from one day to the next. These pupils can also have additional credit placed on their account as set out above and this can be used at any time when the canteen is open.

The library at Rathmore is a valuable, vibrant space at the heart of the school community. The bright attractive space provides study and research facilities to all pupils and staff through the provision of books, periodicals/journals, DVDs and internet-linked computers.

Year 8 pupils are brought to the library every week by their English teacher where they learn how to use the library, borrow books and complete library based tasks.

In September we will be continuing with our library booklet challenge. Pupils will be required to read a significant number of books by a variety of authors and genres in order to achieve Bronze, Silver and Gold Certificates. Pupils are encouraged to use the library out of normal class time for reading, browsing and studying.

General Information

The library has over 20,000 resources – fiction, non-fiction, reference material and DVDs, periodicals/journals and magazines printing and photocopying facilities internet/computer facilities.

Opening hours: 8:30am – 4:30 pm Mon-Fri

Junior pupils can borrow up to 4 books at a time and seniors up to 6 books.

The loan period is 2 weeks.

Pupils also have access to a library app which allows them to check stock, reserve, renew and review items.

We expect pupils to take pride in their uniform and to remember that when they wear it they are representing the school.

Girls' Hair: must be clean, tidy and of a natural colour and style.

Boys' Hair: must be clean, tidy and of a natural colour and style. Cuts shorter than No. 2 are not permitted. Boys must be clean shaven.

Jewellery: the only jewellery permitted is a watch, a small ring and a pair of small stud earrings, one in each ear lobe.

Make-up: make-up is **forbidden** in Years 8–10; a **light** foundation cream permitted for Years 11/12.

Nail varnish/gels/acrylics/fake tan are not permitted.

NOTE TO PARENTS

In order to maintain the public image of the school and to ensure the safety of pupils we ask for your cooperation in ensuring that your child wears **only** what is permitted on the uniform list and that he/she respects all the above regulations.

Many pupils walk to and from school but others travel by bicycle, bus or car. Whichever way your child travels to school, **he/she must be on time.**

Travel by Bus

Routes of school buses are enclosed. If your child travels by bus, please ensure that he/she has a bus pass or bus money each day.

Please note that we expect high standards of courtesy and behaviour from our pupils at bus stops and on school and service buses.

Travel by Car

If you bring your child to school by car, please drop him/her off at the lay-by on the link road.

If your child has an injury, however, and is unable to walk up to school from this point, he/she may get a pass from the Year Head to enable you to drive him/her up to school.

If you are collecting your child by car at 3.25 pm, please wait in St. Anne's Church car park and your child will meet you there.

If you are collecting your child by car following after-school activities, please drive up to school and park in the waiting area outside Music.

Safety of Pupils

Please note that while the school is open from 8am to accommodate parents who wish to drop their children off as they go to work, there is no formal supervision of pupils until 8.45am.

After school, pupils may study in the library from 3.25pm until 4.30pm and then go to a study room which, although not formally supervised, is regularly checked by a "roving" supervisor who keeps an eye on all pupils staying for after-school activities. She is on duty until 5.50pm.

To ensure the safety of all pupils, it is essential that parents use the designated drop off and parking areas and that they follow the instructions of school staff on duty before and after school.
